BIG GAINERS

Arvind Kejriwal | Pulls off a stunning debut, rounding off Sheila Dikshit and dragging Congress to record low. Has shocked BJP too, preventing a safe sweep. Promises a fight in Lok Sabha polls.



Narendra Modi | Has positioned himself as a clear leader in LS polls, thanks to BJP's 3-0 scoreline in MP, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh. His party's painful crawl in Delhi took some sheen off Modi but the momentum is with him.



Veerendra Raju | The Gwalior family royal showed a common touch in exploiting a localised administration, caste and community resentments, anger against inflation, gained from Modi's appeal.



Ramesh Singh | Pulled off a Haudini act in Chhattisgarh, snatching a last-gasp win. Managed to hold off incumbency with good governance and schemes like off-road PDS and health insurance.

Delhi's Hung, No One's Rushing To Form Govt. Another Poll Coming?

New Delhi: Delhi arguably threw up the biggest winners and losers of this round of assembly polls, but at the end of it all it may not have a government in the foreseeable future. AAP made a spectacular debut winning 28 seats, BJP was the single-largest party with 32 (plus one seat for ally Akali Dal), and Congress was reduced to just eight. But none of them seems

to have a realistic chance of cobbling together a majority in the 70-member assembly.

While Lt Governor Najeeb Jung is expected to invite BJP to form a government, the self-proclaimed is unlikely to accept, having fallen four short of a majority. BJP's chief ministerial candidate Harsh Vardhan said, "I can't be part of any government formation as I do not have the numbers. We can't find the promises we made to the voters. I feel helpless."

With sources indicating that the BJP central leadership is serious about sitting it out, chances of a spell of central rule in Delhi look very high. Aam Aadmi Party has already ruled out allying with either Congress or BJP. The stalemate carries the possibility of the city facing another election, possibly along with the LS polls.

There is one school of thought in BJP that feels that if invited by the L-G, the party should take a serious shot at government formation, but the dominant view is averse to engaging in "horse-trading" — something that would shore up

- 1 Tapped in to popular disgust with (and) Congress, but existing political class, with its anti-corruption plank.

- 3 Started last Lok Sabha campaign with Anna as its face, got support of ideological youth. Successfully positioned itself as change agent.
- 4 Created a rainbow coalition of large sections of middle class, lower service sector employees, poor.
- 5 Spectacular campaign on social media and in the field; mobilized committed workers from not just Delhi, but other cities, even abroad. Went door to door in New Delhi.
- 6 BJP was unable to position itself as clear alternative to Cong.

WHAT THE VERDICT MEANS

HOPE BLOOMS FOR BJP

Wins in major states boost BJP's and particularly Modi's status ahead of 2014 Lok Sabha polls. Failure to dethrone AAP in Delhi robs it some sheen, but party derives comfort from belief that the odds will not be able to repeat anti-Congress votes similarly in LS polls. However, winning assembly polls need not be a pointer to LS results. It lost in 2004 LS polls after having won 3 states the year before. Needs to recover in UP, check Nitish Kumar in Bihar, and cover big gaps in south, east and north-east India.

WORRIES MOUNT FOR CONGRESS

The loss of two major state govts will hurt. The rout of the hands of old AAP, whom Congress dismissed as a passing fad, will sting. Overall picture for 2014 looks bleak. High anti-incumbency factor. The latest losses make UPA a lame duck. Inflation, slow growth, corruption, stalled reforms, poor investor confidence and policy logjams come home to roost. Rahul Gandhi's challenges mount as the results are seen to reflect on his role as campaigner. His failure to get traction in rallies will worry Cong.

New Delhi: Congress party's 0-4 mauling and BJP's triumph in three states in what was billed as the "semitinal" for the 2014 elections was the big headline, but the central take-away on super Sunday was Aam Aadmi Party's stunning debut in Delhi, prising open space in national politics for an outsider.

Congress's debacle exposed its sliding popularity and Rahul Gandhi's failure to connect with the voters. It has also fertilised the perception of Narendra Modi-led BJP being the frontrunner for 2014. For all practical purposes, the UPA government will now be a lame duck one.

The BJP won a three-fourth majority in Rajasthan, scored a two-third victory in Madhya Pradesh and beat back Congress in Chhattisgarh after a long drought. In Delhi, only AAP prevented BJP from a clear victory but its tally

of 31 still underscored its advantage over Congress which crumbled to a measly eight seats. The clear man of the match was AAP's Arvind Kejriwal. He not only beat Sheila Dikshit by a margin of over 25,000 votes, his party fed off a deep disillusionment with the political class, boosting hopes of a new brand of politics, perhaps a desi version of the Arab Spring. As a result, the spunky rookie subverted traditional assumptions about vote banks by drawing support from diverse socio-economic strata. AAP

ZACATECAS, June 27. (By The New York Times.)
June 28.—Aguascalientes, capital of the State of the same name, has been evacuated by the Federalists, according to information reaching Gen. Villa's headquarters today.

Last Wednesday it was announced that the Villa troops would be taken toward Agua Calientes according to late reports above that the forces of the Federalists here were much stronger than at first reported. The number of prisoners taken by Villa's troops exceed 100.
The release of Huerta's note to the United States was reported by the Consul here, who was over 100 dead and 1,100 wounded, but these figures are not complete.
